COACH'S INTERPRETIVE –100% Proceeds donated to ISI Education Fund

Rules and judges criteria are the same as Interpretive. The event will be run on Friday or Saturday late afternoon/evening in the 1980 Arena! Entry form is located in the Coaches section of the web site.

TEAM INTERPRETIVE

Rules and judges criteria are the same as interpretive with the addition of unison. This event is open to groups of 3 to 6 skaters. Teams will be able to pick from a selection of music starting at registration and have until the event to work on their routine. NO help from coaches; this is supposed to be a fun event to give skaters a chance to work together as well as give them something to do during their free time. The entry fee is \$35.00 per skater.

SIT SPIN COMPETITION

This year the ISI Lake Placid ISI Championships will again be offering a sit spin competition. All skaters will do sit change sit, change sit, change sit, etc. until only one skater is left spinning. Skaters who do not remain in a sitting position may be disqualified. The winner will receive a trophy. The entry fee is \$15.00.

This event is open to skaters of all levels.

FINAL ROUND ARTISTIC & FINAL ROUND SPOTLIGHT UNDER SPOTLIGHTS

Skaters placing first in their Artistic and/or Spotlight events are eligible for this event. The events will take place in the 1980 Arena with minimal lighting and spotlights. Levels will be divided by Pre-Bronze / Alpha – Delta, Bronze / FS 1 – 3, Silver / FS 4 – 5, and Gold/Platinum / FS 6 – 10. Skaters may register at the registration table after their initial round results have been posted. The events will be held on Saturday before the team events. The entry fee is \$35.00.

DANCE STEP SEQUENCE

Competitors will skate the Dance Steps at the highest freestyle or Dance level passed. There is no music for this event. The Dance Step sequence will be skated twice, continuously, with minimal connecting steps in between sequences. Skaters will be judged on cleanliness of turns and edges, flow, posture, and pattern.
